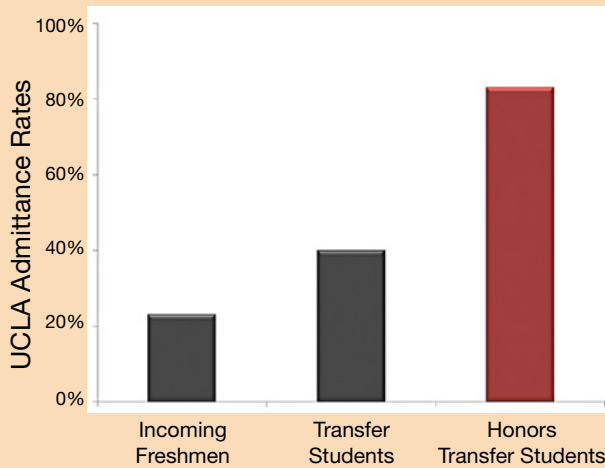


*Give yourself an edge*

# Our Program



Norco Campus is proud to be a part of the district-wide RCCD honors program. Honors students enroll in seminar style classes with a maximum of 20 students. Emphasizing the reading of primary texts, relying on discussion rather than lecture and engaging in substantial written work help develop critical thinking skills and prepare students for successful transfer to a four year college/university.

## ADMISSION

To be admitted to the Honors Program students must meet the following eligibility standards:

- 3.00 GPA\*
- Eligibility for /completion of ENG-1A

Successful applicants must also complete the Honors Program Application. Incoming High School students and students not currently enrolled at RCCD must also complete the RCCD application process. Students who do not currently meet the minimum eligibility requirements, yet believe in their ability to succeed in the Honors Program, are encouraged to complete and submit the Petition for Special Admittance Form along with the program application.

*\*for current college students GPA is based upon nine (9) transferable college courses; otherwise High School GPA may be used.*

## TRANSFER AGREEMENTS

RCCD Honors Program maintains transfer agreements with a variety of universities and colleges. Participation in these agreements is contingent upon the student's successful completion of the Honors Program; completing six (6) honors courses and maintain an overall GPA of 3.0. Students completing the Honors Program enjoy enhanced transfer considerations such as special scholarships, housing priority, priority registration and more.
